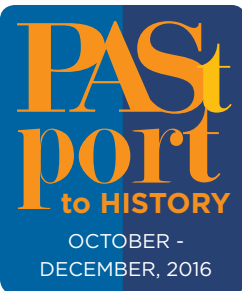


Pull Up a Chair: Hidden Stories of Albany's Famous Seats

Albany County Historical Association

ACHA is based at the 1798 **Ten Broeck Mansion** in historic Arbor Hill. Enjoy the December Holiday House events in the beautifully decorated mansion, which was home to Revolutionary War General Abraham Ten Broeck and Elizabeth Van Rensselaer. ♦ This was also a seat of power for Ten Broeck, who conducted important business here as state senator and Albany mayor. It's fitting to find a 1836 NYS Senate chair in the ACHA collections.



Albany Institute of History & Art

Explore topics from colonial history to contemporary art at New York's oldest museum. ♦ **The Art of Seating** (10/1-12/31) is organized by the Museum of Contemporary Art, Jacksonville in collaboration with the Thomas H. and Diane DeMell Jacobsen Ph.D. Foundation and is toured by International Arts & Artists, Washington, DC. Also Spotlight: Alexander Hamilton and Rock & Roll Icons: Photographs by Patrick Harbron (opens 11/5).



Crailo State Historic Site

As the museum of the colonial Dutch in the Hudson River Valley, Crailo State Historic Site tells the stories of 17th-century Dutch colonists, Native American traders, and the free and enslaved African-Americans who helped build New Netherland. ♦ Crailo displays furniture designed in the 17th century Dutch tradition, including a chair that will never wobble on an uneven floor.



Historic Albany Foundation

Since 1974 the Foundation has been identifying, protecting, preserving and interpreting the historic built environment. See the very best in Albany's architecture and ongoing preservation efforts during the Holiday House Tour on 12/11 from Noon-4 pm. ♦ The HAF Architectural Parts Warehouse will have a special 20% off sale on all chairs during October!



Historic Cherry Hill

Take a tour of "CHAIRy" Hill, and view the lives of five generations of the Van Rensselaer household (1787-1963) through a wild assortment of chairs representing a motley array of people, stories, designs and functions (regular tour schedule). ♦ Special Murder at Cherry Hill tours investigate the scene of an 1827 crime and the perspectives of those present on that fateful evening. (Fri., 10/28 and Sat., 10/29 at 4, 5:30 & 7 pm).



State of New York

New York State Capitol

New York's "Seat of Government" is an architectural masterpiece. ♦ Exhibits include a wheelchair used by FDR. Join in these special fall tours: **The Man in the Chair: Franklin Delano Roosevelt**, highlighting FDR's terms as NYS Senator and Governor (10/6 at 1 and 5:30pm.

RSVP required at www.empirestateplaza.org); and an Empire State Plaza Art Collection tour of **Isamu Noguchi, Artist and Designer** who also designed chairs! (11/2, Noon). *Tours begin at the ESP Visitor Center.*



Schuyler Mansion State Historic Site

Revolutionary War Major-General Philip J. and Catharine van Rensselaer Schuyler's home epitomized refined elegance. A "Who's Who" guest list connected Albany to the world, from America's founders, including son-in-law Alexander Hamilton, to prisoner-guest British General John Burgoyne, to French exiles fleeing the French Revolution. ♦ The Hepplewhite chair featured was restored to its original high-style 1790s luster, when it would have had the likes of Talleyrand, Washington or Hamilton resting upon it. *Check tour availability before visiting.*



Shaker Heritage Society

The Shaker Heritage Society is located at the site of America's first shaker settlement and provides programming that explores the Shaker ideals of sustainability, cooperation, compassion, and the pursuit of a meaningful life. ♦ Monk and poet Thomas Merton wrote: "The peculiar grace of a Shaker chair is due to the fact that it was made by someone capable of believing that an angel might come and sit on it."



Stephen and Harriet Myers Residence

A must-see, the Myers Residence is an outstanding Anti-Slavery period artifact and a tribute to the work of African American Abolitionists and Freedom Seekers. ♦ The Vigilance Committee, chaired by Stephen Myers, met here and worked to ensure equity and justice for all Americans.
