Wednesday, April 16, Drawing Skillfully

Explore drawing from direct observation. Learn the fundamentals of line, value, form, perspective, composition and proportion by sketching in our galleries.

Learn about horses and hitching posts by visiting our newest exhibition, **Horsing Around: 19th Century Cast Iron Hitching Posts**. In the studio, use hand building techniques with an air-drying clay to create horse figures.

This class will employ basic metalworking techniques by embossing lines and textures into a soft metal. Participants will apply geometry principles including diameter, radius, and symmetry to make an artistic design.

Thursday, April 3 or Friday, April 11, Drawing & Color

Discover how to make skillfully composed drawings from simple objects. Explore the use of color and learn how to render light and shadow.

Thursday, May 8 or Friday, May 16, Decorative Parlor

Learn about objects that were used in parlors during the 1800's. In the studio use decorative paper and cutting techniques to design a 3-dimensional paper parlor room.
