Biographical Note

Robert J. Shillinglaw was a public relations officer for the New York State Public Service Commission for approximately twenty years until his retirement in 1971. He had been assistant public relations officer for about ten years earlier, prior to which he had been principal of the Castleton High School. He was the son-in-law of Edward Bates, who was a reporter for the *Albany Evening Journal* from about 1900 to the 1920s, and later for the *Albany Sunday Telegram* until it closed in 1928. In later years, Mr. Bates was the resident correspondent for the *New York Herald-Tribune*, the *American Banker*, and the *Bond Buyer Daily*. He also served as superintendent of the pressroom at the State Capitol. The photographs were collected by Mr. Bates, and were donated to the Albany Institute of History & Art in November 1979 by Robert Shillinglaw.

Scope and Content Note

The main Shillinglaw Photograph Collection spans the period from about 1900 to the late 1920s, except for one photograph from 1885 and another copied from an 1860s print. In the listing below, the entry for each photograph is followed by a date, if one is known. In most circumstances, the date indicates when the photograph was published in a newspaper and is not necessarily the date that the photograph was taken. If a photograph entry is not followed by a date, its date is unknown. The Shillinglaw Photograph Collection primarily contains photographs made in and near Albany. A few of the photographs are attributed to photographers and their names follow in brackets; all of the others were taken for the *Albany Evening Journal* or the *Sunday Telegram*.

An addendum to the Shillinglaw collection consists of 21 photos of the Executive Mansion, most of them interiors and art works from the mid-1960s. One photo, a copy of a painting, depicts the Executive Mansion in 1865. The photographer is not known. These photographs had been separated from the main collection and were found again in 2003.

Series I. PEOPLE has three subseries, Individuals, Athletes, and Groups. The Individuals are further subdivided into those with and without identification. Athletes, principally members of the Albany baseball team of the New York State League in the early 1900's, are also subdivided into those whose identities are known and those not. The Groups subseries includes photographs made for the *Albany Evening Journal* in 1905.

<u>Series II. TRANSPORTATION</u> contains three subseries: Trolley Cars, Buses, and Steam Locomotives, all generally taken in the period around 1914. It also includes a copy photo of the U.S. Military Railroad locomotive "Erastus Corning" from the Civil War period.

<u>Series III. BUILDINGS</u> contains six subseries: Churches, Businesses, Clubs and Associations, Private Residences, Public Buildings and Schools. The photographs generally date within the period 1900 to 1928. This group also includes two conceptual buildings.

<u>Series IV. CONSTRUCTION</u> includes work on the Port of Albany, the filling of the old Erie Canal, and other projects.

<u>Series V. STREETS</u> includes streets with buildings and streets without buildings, including roads to or within parks

Series VI. MISCELLANEOUS contains four subseries: Disasters, Events, Views and

Other. Included are photographs of the Memorial Hospital fire, servicemen leaving Albany in World War I, and the St. Anthony's Church street fair of circa 1905.

<u>Series VII EXECUTIVE MANSION</u> contains 21 photographs of the Executive Mansion on Eagle Street, of which all but one were made in the mid-1960s while Nelson A. Rockefeller was governor. They include many interior views and copies of artwork. The other photo is a copy of a painting of the mansion in 1865.

The main Shillinglaw Photograph Collection was processed by Francis "Doc" Rivett in September 1998.
