# The Schuyler Sisters & Their Circle

JULY 20-DECEMBER 29, 2019

The smash hit Hamilton: An American Musical, which opened in 2015 and is touring the country, has made national celebrities of Albany's native daughters, Angelica, Elizabeth (Eliza), and Margaret (Peggy) Schuyler, the eldest children of Major General Philip Schuyler and his wife Catharine Van Rensselaer. Who could have predicted that Albany history would play a major part in a sensational Broadway musical because Elizabeth Schuyler married Alexander Hamilton?

Sparked by the phenomenal success of the show, the Albany Institute of History & Art has organized the exhibition The Schuyler Sisters & Their Circle (July 20 - December 29, 2019). There is no better place than the Albany Institute to develop and mount this exhibition. After all, the Institute was founded in 1791, when their dear friend and house guest, George Washington, was President.

This exhibition explores the world of the women of the Schuyler family as mothers, social managers, collection businesswomen, influencers, and revolutionaries. They and members of their circle were the movers and shakers of the 18th century before, during, and after the American Revolution. For fans of the musical, we're putting them back in the narrative.

This is a major loan exhibition and we are grateful to over 25 public and private institutions and individuals that have graciously agreed to lend their treasures to this exhibition. For the first time, objects associated with the Schuyler sisters will be brought together for a special exhibition in their hometown and displayed in the museum's grand galleries. The exhibition will feature clothing, decorative arts, portraits, and manuscripts from the 18th and early 19th centuries.

Treasured loan objects include Eliza Hamilton's wedding ring, oil portraits of Eliza and Angelica, a small portrait of Thomas Jefferson that Angelica owned, and a lock of Alexander Hamilton's hair that Eliza cut from his head on the day he died. A letter written by Stephen Van Rensselaer III, after his wife Peggy Schuyler's untimely death will move you to tears. The Albany Institute's own collection includes Philip Schuyler's 1769 Commonplace Book. The Institute's fine and decorative arts collection is remarkably rich in the period 1750-1810, and will enhance the Schuyler story.

Her Flag: 100 Years. 36 States. 1 Artist's Journey.

2020 marks the 100th anniversary of the 19th amendment to the U.S. Constitution. It took almost a year for 36 states to ratify it into law. In June 2019, Artus began traveling the path of ratification and started to collaborate with female artists from all of the historically relevant 36 states. At each stop she is creating a stripe that is being stitched together onsite in the capital city. When Her Flag is completed in August of 2020, it will be a 36 stripe flag, one for each of the ratifying states that turned the 19th amendment into law. The culmination will be a new flag sewn as a thank you and a love letter to the states that gave women the right to vote. Join us for the

addition of the New York State stripe and to celebrate the anniversary of women's right to vote.
