Albany Institute of History & Art Announces 2025 Museum Gala Honoring Christine Miles Kelliher

Founded in 1791, the **Albany Institute of History & Art** is New York's oldest museum. Its collections document the Hudson Valley as a crossroads of culture, influencing the art and history of the region, the state, and the nation. With more than 35,000 objects in the collection and one million documents in the research library, it is an important resource for the region, giving a sense of the part the Hudson Valley played in the American story. Permanent exhibitions include one of the largest collections of Hudson River School paintings, a history of Ancient Egypt, and other fine art, ceramics, and furniture, along with temporary exhibitions that change three times per year.
