Biographical/Historical

Connie Frisbee is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Edward Frisbee of Stuyvesant Falls. Connie became a member of the 4-H Club in 1957. She excelled in making clothing and was active in flowers and gardening, home improvement, and photography. She was active in the 4-H Council and was Vice President of the group.

The 4-H Club began around the start of the 20th Century, and grew out of the work of several people in different parts of the United States who were concerned about the

youth. It started with the desire to make public school education more connected to country life. Early programs tied both public and private resources together for the purpose of helping the rural youth. 4-H members participate in "hands-on" learning. In the beginning, 4-H taught rural children new agriculture technology. Life skills development was built into 4-H projects with activities and events to help children become contributing, productive, and self-directed members of society. The organization changed in the 1960's combining 4-H groups divided by gender or race into a single integrated program.

Scope and Contents

This collection represents Connie Frisbee's activities in the 4-H Club. There are several scrapbooks containing information on clothing projects done by Connie between the years 1957-1963. There are also official reports on the projects done by Connie along with photographs of the events. There are several ribbons won by Connie at 4-H Club events. There is also information on the 4-H Club including two scrapbooks of newspaper articles and pamphlets.
