Biography of Joel Burdick

In 1879, Joel W. Burdick took a job as a clerk with the D & H (Delaware and Hudson) Railroad at their Albany office. He and his second wife Ella, whom he married in the previous year, moved from their home in central New York to the capital city. Burdick rose rapidly in the company, becoming manager of the railroad's telegraph system and then general passenger agent in 1885. As passenger agent, Burdick was responsible for all of the railroad's passenger services, a position that allowed him to purchase a large house in the Pine Hills neighborhood of west Albany.

The Burdicks traveled extensively throughout the United States and Canada, probably as a result of Joel's position with the D & H Railroad. In addition to destinations in the United States and Canada, the family also toured abroad. In 1922 and 1923, Joel and Ella traveled aboard the ship *Franconia*, the first passenger cruise ship to circumnavigate the globe. Joel Burdick later documented this trip around the world in his book <u>Our World Tour 1922-23</u>.

Scope and Contents of the Records

The documents contained in this collection mainly revolve around Joel Burdick's personal life. The two largest portions of his personal life that are focused upon are his houses and his family. The primary formats of documentation are photographs, newspaper clippings, and correspondence. Most of this material focuses on the time period between the 1890's and the 1920's.

Organization of the Records

The documents in this collection are organized into 3 boxes, the last of which is an oversize box. The first box contains 19 folders, each surrounding a particular subject that relates to the Burdick family. The first two folders relate to friends of Joel Burdick, namely Charles Jay Taylor and Frederic Remington. Folder 3 contains a collection of letters sent from Joel Burdick to his wife and children while he served in the Red Cross during World War I. Folder 4 consists of pictures of Joel Burdick throughout various stages of his life. Folder 5 has a wide variety of documents, including newspaper clippings, photographs, and copies of written documents. Folders 6, 7, and 8 consist of photographs of Joel Burdick's wife, their children, and the family members that came before them. Folders 9, 10, and 11 contain photographs of the Burdick

family's houses in Pittsburgh and New York. Folder 12 has a marriage form from the marriage of Lewis Parsons Evans and Marion Burdick. Folder 13 contains a book titled <u>Christian Life</u>, which was owned by Marion Burdick. Folders 14 and 15 consist of two books, which were written about a trip around the world aboard the *Franconia*, written by Joel Burdick and Halbert Hitchcock, respectively. Folders 16, 17, and 18 have three books of genealogy relating to the family of Ella Pixley Bartlett, the wife of Joel Burdick. Folder 19 contains a videocassette about an exhibition done at Ithaca College on Joel Burdick's Native American basket collection.

The second box contains 1 folder, which has a photo album containing pictures of the children of the Burdick and Evans family.

The third box contains two folders, the first of which has a family photograph of Joel Burdick and his wife with their children and grandchildren in front of one of their houses. The second folder in this box contains a photo album consisting of pictures of the Burdick family and their house in Albany.
