Biographical Note

The photographer whose work comprises this collection was William Kelly Prentice, born in 1871. He was a grandson of Ezra Parmalee Prentice, the builder of Mount Hope farm, where most of the pictures were made. William Kelly Prentice was in his teens when he made these pictures during the period 1885 to 1890, according to his daughter, Mrs. Xaver von Erdberg (the former Joan Prentice) who donated the collection to the Albany Institute in 1981. William Kelly Prentice published a biography of his father and family history, *Eight Generations, the Ancestry, Education, and Life of William Packer Prentice* (1947).

Ezra Parmalee Prentice (1797-1876) came to Albany in 1826 and entered the fur trading business, from which he retired in 1840 with what he described as a "reasonable competence." He later became president of the Albany and Susquehanna Railroad, and president of the Commercial Bank of Albany. In 1834, Prentice and his brother John purchased the 100-acre Mount Hope farm from Col. Solomon Van Rensselaer. A year later, they built a wooden house for their parents and their two unmarried sisters. By 1840, Ezra bought out his brother's share and soon constructed the 59 by 64 foot mansion and several outbuildings atop Mount Hope. The entrance to Mount Hope from Kenwood Road (now South Pearl Street) was marked by two imposing lions on pedestals at the gate. The mansion burned in 1950, but the lions survive, guarding the entrance to another Mount Hope Farm outside Williamstown, Mass. Albany's Mount Hope farm is now the site of the Mount Hope townhouse development up the hill, and the Ezra Prentice Homes, a public low-rent housing project, along South Pearl Street.

Scope and Content Note

The Mount Hope collection spans the period from 1885 to 1890 and primarily contains photographs relating to the Prentice farm and family life. The collection of seventy-three paper prints is divided into four series: Prentice Family; Mount Hope; Normans Kill and Kenwood; Miscellaneous.

<u>Series I. PRENTICE FAMILY</u>, contains photographs of varying quality of many family members, generally identified on the verso by first name and relationship.

<u>Series II. MOUNT HOPE ESTATE</u> holds landscapes of the farm, including lawn statuary and the entrance gate lions, exterior and interior views of the mansion.

<u>Series III. NORMANS KILL AND KENWOOD</u>, has views of the Normans Kill gorge south of the city of Albany and of Kenwood to the west of the gorge, including photos of the Delaware & Hudson Railroad, and the Hack mill and its power dam.

Series IV. MISCELLANEOUS, is arranged in four subseries: Lebanon Shaker Village, with a group of visitors, a panorama, and a view of the flower gardens; Albany Rural Cemetery, with views of a funeral procession, the Prentice family lot, and a statue *Angel of the Sepulchre* (on the Roberts Lenox Banks lot) by Albany sculptor Erastus Dow Palmer; Rhinecliff, with views of the Hutton House, the Hudson River, and the meadows at Grassmere; and Miscellaneous views, with a photographs made at Cooperstown and at the Corning farm.
