Biographical/Historical

Dr. Charles Knickerbacker Winne Jr. (1877-1964), a prominent Albany physician, was also an avid genealogist, interested particularly in the history of the Winne family, but also in the Frey (his mother's family), Fonda, Fondoy, Viele, van Schaack, Hun, van der Poel, and Knickerbacker families. Most of this collection consists of unorganized, undated, and fragmentary genealogical notes, primarily on the Winne family. There is

also some personal correspondence, mostly with Dr. Winne's cousin Kathylyne Knickerbocker Viele (1853-1924); correspondence relating to Dr. Winne's membership in various genealogical organizations (the Holland Society of New York, Dutch Settlers Society of Albany, and the Huguenot Society of New York); several printed items; and a few, mostly unidentified, photographs.
