ALBANY INSTITUTE TO HOST CONTEMPORARY ARTISTS FOR SPECIAL GALLERY TALK

February 27, 2014, 6PM-8PM

ALBANY, NY- On Thursday, February 27, 2014, the Albany Institute of History & Art will host a special gallery talk with some of the artists featured in the exhibition BIG + BOLD: Contemporary Paintings, Sculpture, and Collage from the Albany Institute's Collection. Artists such as Marcia Clark, Abraham Ferraro, David Miller, Chester Rose, Thomas Sarrantonio, Susan Stuart, and Leigh Wen will share their insights and discuss the role of contemporary art at the Albany Institute of History & Art. The program starts at 6PM. This event is free and open to the public as part of the Institute's *Evening at the Institute* initiative where the museum is open for free from 5PM-8PM on Thursday nights.

The BIG + BOLD exhibition features works that captivate with visual bravado, allurement, and in some cases audacity. Most of the works on view were purchase prizes selected by the Albany Institute from the annual Exhibition by Artists of the Mohawk-Hudson Region. Founded in 1936, this annual juried exhibition is one of the longest running regional art exhibitions in the country. Highlighting the works of artists living and working in the upper Hudson Valley, the Mohawk Hudson Regional has played an important role in documenting the rich and diverse artistic activity in the area. The pieces included in this exhibition were made by professors and graduates from area colleges and universities, such as Skidmore College, the College of Saint Rose, and the University at Albany, SUNY.

BIG + BOLD is on view at the Albany Institute of History & Art through Sunday, April 20, 2014. The museum is located at 125 Washington Avenue in downtown Albany, New York. The museum is open Wednesday-Saturday 10AM-5PM, Thursdays until 8PM and Sunday Noon-5PM. On Tuesdays, the museum is open to registered groups only. The museum is closed on Mondays and major holidays. Admission is FREE for Albany Institute members; \$10/adults; \$8/seniors and students with ID; \$6/children 6-12; FREE/children under 6. Admission is free on Thursday nights (5PM-8PM).
