ALBANY INSTITUTE TO HOST CLARK ART INSTITUTE DIRECTOR FOR FREE LECTURE

Hardymon Director Olivier Meslay will discuss the Clark Art Institute's summer 2018 exhibitions at a free lecture on Thursday, July 26 at 6PM.

ALBANY, NEW YORK — On Thursday, July 26 at 6pm, Hardymon Director of the Clark Art Institute Olivier Meslay will be at the Albany Institute of History & Art to discuss the Clark Art Institute's summer 2018 exhibitions. This free lecture is open to the public. Space is limited. Seats are available on a first-come, first-served basis.

The Clark Art Institute's summer season kicks off with the opening of two exhibitions rooted in late nineteenth-century France, *Women Artists in Paris, 1850–1900* and *The Art of Iron: Objects from the Musée Le Secq des Tournelles, Rouen, Normandy Normandy*. On June 30, the Clark opened its first-ever video exhibition, *Jennifer Steinkamp*, and on July 1 *A City Transformed: Photographs of Paris, 1850-1900* celebrates the beauty of old wrought iron collected largely during the late nineteenth century, a period of rapid modernization in France and Europe.

Founded in 1791, the Albany Institute of History & Art is New York's oldest museum. Its collections document the Hudson Valley as a crossroads of culture, influencing the art and history of the region, the state, and the nation. With more than 35,000 objects and one million documents in the library, it is an important resource for the region, giving our community a sense of the part the Hudson Valley played in the American story, and our own place in history. Permanent and temporary exhibitions are open year-round and create a sense of place, allowing visitors to meet the people who helped shape this region. Among the museum's best-known and most-loved collections are the 19th century Hudson River School landscape paintings by artists like Thomas Cole and Frederic Church, the 19th century sculpture collections, and, of course, the famous Albany Mummies that came to the museum in 1909 and have been on view ever since.
